English

Punctuation and Grammar

Writing in sentences with full stops and capital letters.
Children will be introduced to question marks (?) and exclamation marks (!)
The children will learn how to use the connective 'and' in sentences.

Reading Comprehension

Children will learn the skills required for understanding what they have read.
They will learn to talk about the main character and discuss what they like and dislike about a book.

Art & Design

Our artist for this term is Pablo Picasso.
By studying his pictures the children will learn the following techniques;
Drawing lines of varying thickness.
Mixing colours.
Collage.

Computing

The children will be learning how to be Treasure Hunters.
We will be using maps and Bee-bots to locate and move a machine around by creating algorithms.

Mathematics

Through interactive and practical activities the children will learn the following in number and measurement.

The children will also learn how to apply this knowledge by solving one-step problems involving addition or subtraction. They will use objects, pictorial representations and arrays.

Measurement and Geometry

Recognise and name 2D shapes; circle; triangle; square and oblong.
Name the days of the week and months of the year.

Number

Count reliably to 100.
Write all numbers in words to 20.
Say the number that is one more or one less than a number to 100.
Recall all additions number bonds to 20.

Design & Technology

The children will create their own jungle by making natural landmarks and other suggestions the children have from learning about the Jungle environment.
They will learn how to cut, bend and stick carefully by selecting the appropriate materials.

Swimming

Jump in from poolside safely.
Blow bubbles a minimum of three times rhythmically with nose and mouth submerged.
Regain upright position from the back without support.
Regain an upright position from the front without support.
Push from wall and glide on the back and front

Physical Education

Games

Begin to develop ball-handling skills
Creating and playing games.
Learning playground games to encourage cooperation.
Understanding and appreciating of games.
Develop problem-solving and decision-making strategies.

Music

Using our voices and bodies as instruments.
Activities will include:
Using my voice to express different sounds.
Matching my voice to pictures and music.
Learning new songs with actions.
Using my body to make a beat.

Science

Staying alive and how to be healthy.
The children will learn about the human body and the job of our teeth.

Animals

What do animals eat? How we can classify them into categories?

Plants

How to grow and look after plants effectively.

Humanities

Learning how to identify land use around school.
Creating our own maps and investigating to answer questions such as,
What is this place like?

What do people do in this place?
Use aerial photographs to identify key features and landmarks around and inside their school.

We will be investigating the animals, plants and food we can find in the Jungle.

Gymnastics

Develop basic movement actions.
Show control in take-off and develop the ability to absorb energy to avoid shock when landing.
Link movement skills to produce individual and pair sequences.
Practise rolling activities leading to the forward roll.
